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NATIONAL NIGHT OUT IS TUESDAY, AUGUST 6 – REGISTER TO HOST A NEIGHBORHOOD EVENT BY MONDAY, JULY 22

Chino Hills, CA – The City of Chino Hills’ award-winning National Night Out (NNO) program returns on Tuesday, August 6 from 6:00 pm to 9:00 pm. NNO is an annual community-building campaign held throughout the nation to promote police and community partnerships. These partnerships help combat crime, heighten drug prevention awareness, and strengthen neighborhood camaraderie to make neighborhoods safer, more caring places to live.

Neighborhoods in Chino Hills participate each year by hosting their own potlucks, ice cream socials, block gatherings, and activities for kids. Neighborhood events are hosted individually by residents and are not organized by the City. Residents who register their events through the City’s website at www.chinohills.org/NNO by Monday, July 22 will receive a free neighborhood organizing kit, while supplies last. Each kit includes an NNO banner, information flyers to share with neighbors addressing various trending, emergency, crime, and safety topics, giveaways for kids, a child identification fingerprinting kit, and more.

Residents interested in attending an NNO event in their neighborhood are encouraged to host their own individual event or work with a neighborhood group such as a homeowner’s association or neighborhood watch group to organize one. While events are registered with the City of Chino Hills, each gathering is planned by the registered hosts(s). Each host has the opportunity to welcome guests from various neighborhoods or can specify on their registration form if they are only interested in hosting for their own neighborhood.

During the event evening, Chino Hills City Council Members, City staff, Chino Hills Police Deputies, Chino Valley Fire District personnel with their engines, Citizens on Patrol, McGruff the crime-fighting dog, and Sparky the fire safety dog will visit as many registered events as possible. Police, Fire, and City officials will fan out in the community with the goal that each event will receive a visit from at least one agency. Due to the number of events planned, it is not possible for each agency to visit all the events and a visit is not guaranteed.
