## **CHINO HILLS CITY COUNCIL MEMBER RAY MARQUEZ ELECTED AS PRESIDENT OF SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY**

Chino Hills, CA – Chino Hills City Council Member Ray Marquez was elected to serve as the President of the [San Bernardino County Transportation Authority](#) (SBCTA) for the 2024-2025 year by the SBCTA Board of Directors, effective July 1. SBCTA is responsible for cooperative regional transportation planning Countywide to improve the quality of life and mobility for the more than 2.1 million residents of San Bernardino County. Council Member Marquez will serve a concurrent term as President of the [San Bernardino Council of Governments](#) Board of Directors, which represents the 24 cities and towns in San Bernardino County.

“It is an honor to have been elected as President of San Bernardino County Transportation Authority by my fellow board members,” said Council Member Ray Marquez. “Having an active role and strong voice in regional transportation planning and decision-making not only ensures we can address the transportation needs and concerns of our residents effectively but can enhance quality of life and mobility for all communities within San Bernardino County.”

President-elect Marquez has represented Chino Hills with an active role in SBCTA since 2015 and was elected to serve as Vice President of SBCTA in 2023. He has also served as Chair of the General Policy Committee, and Vice Chair of the Legislative Policy Committee. He also serves as Second Vice President of the Southern California Association of Governments, and on the Board of Directors for the Southern California Regional Railroad Authority (Metrolink) and the Inland Empire Division of the League of California Cities.

In addition to their regular Council Member duties, all five members of the Chino Hills City Council represent the City on 24 different state, regional, and local boards, committees, and partner agencies to ensure the City has an active role and voice in transportation, education, housing, water, and legislative issues.
