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CITY OF CHINO HILLS TO BEGIN RECYCLED WATER LINE AND PAVEMENT REHABILITATION PROJECT ON EUCALYPTUS AVENUE

Chino Hills, CA – The City of Chino Hills will soon begin construction on Eucalyptus Avenue to expand the City's recycled water infrastructure and enhance the roadway. This project aims to provide an environmentally sustainable water source for irrigation while also improving pavement conditions along a key thoroughfare in Chino Hills. Construction is scheduled to begin in January 2025 and is anticipated to be completed by summer 2025.

The project will install approximately 6,100 linear feet of PVC recycled water main along Eucalyptus Avenue to provide irrigation for high water-consumption areas, including Crossroads Park, Veterans Park, and landscaped open spaces. This project will bring the City's total to nearly 28 miles of recycled water lines in Chino Hills to further help reduce the demand on the City's domestic water resources. The project will also include pavement rehabilitation work along Eucalyptus Avenue, from Chino Hills Parkway to Peyton Drive. This will involve grinding, asphalt concrete overlay, and striping.

Project Construction and Traffic Impacts:

- Preliminary potholing will begin Tuesday, November 12 through Wednesday, November 27, 2024, with intermittent lane closures.
- Construction will begin in January 2025, with expected completion by summer 2025.
- Working hours: 7:00 am to 3:30 pm, Monday through Friday, excluding City holidays.
- Partial lane closures will be in effect during construction. Drivers are advised to plan for minor delays and exercise caution around the work zones.

This project is funded through a \$2.7 million allocation from the City's Water Utility Fund supplemented by \$700,000 of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding. Closures and project duration may adjust due to weather conditions, availability of supplies, or construction delays.
