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CITY OF CHINO HILLS AND CHINO VALLEY FIRE DISTRICT CELEBRATE THE CITY'S FIRST SAVESTATION TOWER AT GRAND AVENUE PARK



Members of the Chino Hills City Council, Chino Valley Fire District, Chino Hills Community Foundation, and Chino Valley Fire Foundation celebrate the City's first SaveStation Tower.

Chino Hills, CA – The City of Chino Hills and Chino Valley Fire District (CVFD) have installed the City's first SaveStation Tower at Grand Avenue Park, located at 1301 Grand Avenue, to further enhance the City's safety and preparedness efforts. The new tower provides the community with 24/7 public access to an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) device designed to assist with life-saving efforts during cardiac emergencies.

The SaveStation Tower is located in a high-traffic area of the park near the tennis courts, and is publicly accessible by any community members visiting the courts, sports fields,

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playground, or trails. If a community member witnesses someone experiencing cardiac arrest, they should first always call 9-1-1, and then access the SaveStation Tower. When a member of the public opens the tower, a notification is activated to alert CVFD and City officials that the AED has been accessed. While members of the Fire District are on their way, community members can use the AED machine to provide life-saving measures until trained professionals arrive and can take over.

The SaveStation Tower and AED machine were generously donated to the City by the Chino Valley Fire Foundation and the Chino Hills Community Foundation. The tower supplements the City's existing AED located in the Grand Avenue Park staff office, providing an additional layer of safety for park visitors.

Officials from the City of Chino Hills, CVFD, and representatives from both Foundations celebrated the installation of the tower during a ribbon-cutting ceremony on Wednesday, January 22. Following the ceremony, attendees participated in a hands-only CPR training session led by CVFD personnel to learn how to provide effective assistance during a cardiac emergency. The City of Chino Hills and CVFD remain committed to ensuring the safety and well-being of all residents.

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
