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**CITY OF CHINO HILLS SEEKS INPUT ON GENERAL PLAN UPDATE –
DRAFT SUBSEQUENT PROGRAM ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT
AVAILABLE FOR PUBLIC REVIEW**

Chino Hills, CA – As part of the City's General Plan Update, the community is invited to review and provide feedback on the Draft Subsequent Program Environmental Impact Report (SPEIR) and the proposed associated 2025 General Plan Elements. The draft SPEIR is open for public review and comment now through Monday, March 3, 2025.

The City of Chino Hills is preparing an update to its General Plan, a state-required document, based on the recently certified Housing Element which incorporates the Regional Housing Needs Assessment (RHNA) housing cycle from 2021-2029. From the time of its incorporation, the City has envisioned itself as a community with a high quality of life while preserving its rural character. The General Plan Update will refine the City's long-term vision to maintain the City's high quality of life, plan for future growth, and to meet the challenges of today.

The draft SPEIR can be viewed online at www.chinohills.org/GeneralPlan or in person at the City of Chino Hills Community Development Department, located on the first floor of City Hall at 14000 City Center Drive, Monday through Friday during normal business hours.

The success of the General Plan Update relies on input from residents, community members, business owners, and other stakeholders to help shape the vision and goals for future planning.
