CITY SEEKS INPUT TO GUIDE THE USE OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT FUNDING FOR LOW- AND MODERATE-INCOME RESIDENTS

RESIDENTS ENCOURAGED TO TAKE SURVEY BY FRIDAY, MAY 30

Chino Hills, CA – The City of Chino Hills is developing its next five-year Consolidated Plan which guides the use of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding provided by the Federal Government to support low and moderate-income residents in the community. Each year, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) provides the City with CDBG funds to help meet the needs of this community through housing and infrastructure projects and public services. Residents are invited to participate in an online survey and share their input by Friday, May 30.

The Consolidated Plan is required by HUD for the City to continue receiving annual CDBG funding. The Plan identifies housing and community development priorities based on local needs and public input. Community participation is an important part of the process and ensures the Plan reflects the community's desires for housing, sets service priority areas, and determines how funding should be distributed across the priority areas to best support low- and moderate-income residents. These priority areas include affordable housing, human services, community facilities, and infrastructure.

Residents are encouraged to participate in the survey at www.chinohills.org/CDBGSurvey by Friday, May 30. Paper copies as well as translated versions in Mandarin Chinese and Spanish, are available at the Community Services counter on the second floor of Chino Hills City Hall, located at 14000 City Center Drive. The City will also hold a virtual Community Workshop via Zoom on Wednesday, May 28 at 2:00 pm to gather input, discuss funding needs, and answer any questions. Community members who do not have access to the internet or require special assistance to participate in the virtual meeting should contact the Community Services Department at least 48 hours before the meeting to allow the City to make reasonable arrangements.
