Participants are encouraged to come dressed in costume for a chance to win prizes in the costume contest, bring their own pumpkins to decorate (decorating supplies provided), and enjoy games, light refreshments, and social time with friends. The City's Halloween festivities conclude with the annual free [Trick-or-Treat](#) at the Shoppes on Friday, October 31, from 3:00 to 5:00 pm, located at 13920 City Center Drive. Families can enjoy trick-or-treating, craft stations, and a costume contest beginning at 4:00 pm. The costume contest is open to children ages 12 and under, with several age divisions and a group/family category.

The City's Mobile Recreation vehicle will host a game area, and City staff, the Chino Hills Police Department, Chino Valley Fire District, and Chino Hills Branch Library will distribute candy while supplies last. The starting point for the event is near the Promenade, and participants are required to bring their own treat bags. This free event is best suited for children from infants to 12 years old.
