RABIES VACCINATION AND LICENSING CLINIC – JUNE 18th

The Inland Valley Humane Society will hold their annual rabies vaccination and licensing clinic on Thursday, June 18th from 7:00-8:00 p.m. at the McCoy Equestrian and Recreation Center, 14280 Peyton Drive. These clinics are well attended. Be prepared to stand in a long line. For your own safety and safety of your pet, all dogs must be on a secure leash and all cats must be in a carrier.

The cost of the rabies vaccination is \$6 each for dogs and \$10 each for cats. Residents with spayed or neutered animals will pay a reduced rate for a dog license upon presentation of the spay or neuter certificate. All dogs over four months old must have a rabies vaccination and be licensed in accordance with State law. If a rabies vaccination could jeopardize your dog's health, check with your veterinarian to see if the Molly's Law exemption applies. Additional vaccinations are available: DHPP - \$15, Bordetella - \$15, FVRCP (feline) - \$18.

Residents may complete the dog license application and submit a current rabies certificate, a spay or neuter certificate, and \$15 license fee to receive their license. Licenses for unaltered dogs cost \$35. Senior citizens, age 65 or older with proof of age, are eligible for a \$5 license fee for altered dogs. A late fee of \$35 is assessed for the late renewal of an expired license. If you need to license your dog but cannot attend the clinic, you may visit the Inland Valley Humane Society at 500 Humane Way, Pomona, 91766.
