## **CHINO HILLS VACCINATION, LICENSING, AND MICROCHIP CLINIC JUNE 23<sup>rd</sup>**

Chino Hills, CA – The Inland Valley Humane Society (IVHS) has scheduled a vaccination, licensing, and microchip clinic for Chino Hills cats and dogs on Thursday, June 23<sup>rd</sup>, from 7:00 to 8:00 p.m. at the McCoy Equestrian Center, 14280 Peyton Drive. All dogs must be on a secure leash, and cats must be in a carrier.

All dogs in Chino Hills, over four months old, must be licensed and microchipped. Licensed dogs owned by Chino Hills residents will be eligible for a free microchip at this event. Residents should download the microchip rebate form from the City's website at [www.chinohills.org/MicrochipRebate](http://www.chinohills.org/MicrochipRebate), complete the form, and bring it to the event. Residents must bring identification showing their Chino Hills address, and submit a copy of their current dog license certificate demonstrating that their dog is registered to their Chino Hills home address. The mandatory microchip requirement significantly increases the likelihood that a lost pet will be returned to their rightful owner quickly.

According to State law all dogs, 4 months of age and older, are required to be vaccinated against rabies. The rabies vaccination costs \$10. If a rabies vaccination could jeopardize your dog's health, check with your veterinarian to see if the Molly's Law exemption applies.

For dog licensing, residents may complete the application at the clinic and submit a current rabies certificate, a spay or neuter certificate, and a \$15 license fee to receive their license. Licenses for unaltered dogs cost \$50. Senior citizens, age 65 or older with proof of age, are eligible for a \$5 license fee for altered dogs. A late fee of \$35 is assessed for the late

renewal of an expired license. Residents may also license their dog at the Inland Valley Humane Society at 500 Humane Way, Pomona, CA 91766 or they may complete an online application at [www.ivhsspca.org](http://www.ivhsspca.org).

Prices for available vaccines are as follows: the 6-in-1 (DHLPP) vaccine is \$15 for dogs 8 weeks and older; the Bordetella vaccine is \$15 for dogs 8 weeks and older; the 4-in-1 (FVRCP) is \$18 for cats 8 weeks and older. Cash, credit, and checks are acceptable payments. Please plan to arrive early to avoid long lines and crowds.
