## **Chino Hills City Council Appoints Brian Johsz to Serve Through 2018**

Chino Hills, CA – At a special meeting on August 14<sup>th</sup>, the Chino Hills City Council voted unanimously to appoint Chino Valley Fire District Board Member, Brian Johsz, to complete the unexpired term of former Council Member Ed Graham, through November 6, 2018.

Mr. Johsz has lived in Chino Hills since 2010. He was elected to the Chino Valley Fire District Board of Directors in 2013 and 2015, and served as President of the Board in 2016. Professionally, he serves as the Director of Government Affairs for Athens Services. He has previously worked for elected officials in the County of San Bernardino, the House of Representatives, and the California State Legislature. Mr. Johsz also has worked for the Boy Scouts of America.

Mr. Johsz is active in the Rotary Club of Rancho del Chino, where he has served on the Board of Directors. He serves on the Board of Managers of the Chino Valley YMCA, and also serves on the local board for the Federal Selective Services System. Mr. Johsz served on the Measure M Citizen's Oversight Committee for the Chino Valley Unified School District as an appointed member. He is a volunteer for the Chino Hills Community Foundation and previously served on the City's Healthy Hills Steering Committee. At the County level, he served as a Commissioner of the San Bernardino County Trails Commission.

Mr. Johsz attended the University of California, Berkeley where he earned a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science. He also earned a Master of Public Administration degree with an Emphasis in Public Management from California State University, Dominguez Hills in Carson.

Mr. Johsz and his wife, Libbie, live in the Fairfield Ranch community. They have two young children Stephen and Anna.
