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## **SCE Pavement Restoration Project to Begin September 13th**

Chino Hills, CA – Southern California Edison has contracted with Henkels & McCoy, Inc. and ASAP Paving to complete pavement restoration work on streets that were affected by construction of the Tehachapi Renewable Transmission Project. The work will include selective removal and reconstruction of the existing pavement. All streets will be slurry sealed with a new surface coating.

The work is scheduled on weekdays between Wednesday, September 13<sup>th</sup> and Friday, October 13<sup>th</sup>. Two message boards were installed at both ends of Eucalyptus Avenue, west of Chino Hills Parkway, on Thursday, September 7<sup>th</sup> to notify motorists of the project. The contractor may not close lanes on Eucalyptus Avenue from Avenida Del Monte to Chino Hills Parkway until 9:00 a.m.; and on Eucalyptus Avenue from Avenida Del Monte to Rancho Hills Road closures may start at 7:00 a.m. Motorists should plan to allow extra time. Two lanes of traffic will be maintained and any lane closures must be cleared by 3:30 p.m.

Door hanger notices will be posted in neighborhoods notifying them of the project and no parking signs will be posted at locations 48 hours in advance of work. The schedule is subject to change. The paving schedule is as follows: Wednesday, September 13<sup>th</sup> - Lobelia Drive & Garden Court; Thursday, September 14<sup>th</sup> – Garden Court and Cork Drive; Friday, September 15<sup>th</sup> – Tupelo Street and Hazelwood Drive; Monday, September 18<sup>th</sup> Eucalyptus Avenue & Calle Madrid.
