2019 State of the City of Chino Hills Community Fair Celebrate Chino Hills - September 21

Chino Hills, CA – Mayor Cynthia Moran has planned a Community Fair for the annual State of the City event, hosted by the Chino Valley Chamber of Commerce. The whole family can “Celebrate Chino Hills” on Saturday, September 21 from 11:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. at the Chino Hills Community Center, 14250 Peyton Drive. Overflow parking will be available at the Ruben S. Ayala High School student parking lot. Visitors may stop by a booth near the gazebo to pick up a hand-held fan that includes the event schedule, and a free “Celebrate Chino Hills” jute tote bag, while quantities last. A new “Celebrate Chino Hills” short promotional video will be playing in the banquet hall and local photographers Erik Simonsen, Ayla Qureshi, and Coleen Hagenson will display their favorite photos. The outdoor gazebo will be center stage, starting with a performance by the Dynamite Dawson Band to kick-off the event at 11:00 a.m. Chino Valley Fire District personnel will offer “What We Wear,” a demonstration of the different uniforms they wear to do their job at 11:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m.

At noon, Mayor Cynthia Moran will lead the Unsung Hero ceremony. LiLi Joy, a Chino Hills resident and season 16 contestant on “The Voice,” will sing the National Anthem. Members of the City Council will join Mayor Moran onstage to recognize the individuals nominated for this honor. The 2019 Unsung Heroes are Sharon Stuewe, Ronnie Guyer, Nicole Aptekar, Douglas Sparkes, and Simon Ho. At 12:45 p.m., a K9 team from the San Bernardino County Probation Department will demonstrate the work they do in the field.

Throughout the day, local Chino Hills Police Department and Chino Valley Fire District personnel will be grilling FREE hamburgers and hot dogs (while quantities last), and providing free chips and water. Many agencies that provide services to Chino Hills residents will join City staff, the Chino Hills Police Department, and the Chino Valley Independent Fire District by providing interactive booths, games, and displays. Various Police, Fire, SWAT, CHART (Chino Hills Auxiliary Radio Team), and Public Works vehicles and equipment will be

on display. Kids will enjoy a CSI crime scene activity, the Fire Safety House, and an inflatable obstacle course and bounce house. Experience the violent shaking of a major earthquake in the Seismic Simulator and try your hand at "Dunking a Deputy" in the Dunk Tank! Learn more about water conservation, storm drain pollution, and emergency preparedness and stop to see the water model.

Other participants include: Chino Hills Community Foundation, Chino Hills State Park, Chino Valley Chamber of Commerce, Inland Empire Utilities Agency, Inland Valley Humane Society, James S. Thalman Chino Hills Branch Library, Omnitrans, West Valley Mosquito and Vector Control District, Republic Services, and Athens Services. City booths include Code Enforcement, Community Development, Community Services, and Healthy Hills. Various agencies will contribute "props" for the "Dressed to do the Job Right Selfie Station." Families may select a hard hat and vest, or a fire fighters helmet, among other items, before posing for a selfie.

There will also be treats available for purchase, including Chino Hills Citizens on Patrol snow cones and cotton candy, kettle corn, Mobile Munchies, and beverages.
