Chino Hills, CA – The City of Chino Hills will provide Chino Hills residents with a free, fun, and safe way to Trick-or-Treat in your car while maintaining social distancing on Friday, October 30 from 3:30 to 5:30 p.m. Experience the sights and sounds of all things Halloween as you “Drive Through Trick or Treat” at the Chino Hills Community Center parking lot, 14250 Peyton Drive. City booths along with local agencies will be decorating car trunks for your viewing pleasure in various Halloween themes. Children will enjoy take-home craft activity kits, swag items, entertainment, candy, and more. Feel free to dress in your best costumes. There can never be too much Halloween spirit!

All vehicles are required to register for a "free" time slot ticket to attend the event and will only be allowed to attend the event during their reserved time slot to ensure traffic flows swiftly and there is candy for everyone. Vehicles may only register for one 15 minute time slot; 3:30-3:45 pm, 3:45-4:00 pm, 4:00-4:15 pm, 4:15-4:30 pm, 4:30-4:45 pm, 4:45-5:00 pm, 5:00-5:15 pm, or 5:15-5:30 pm. Entry into the event will be via the southbound lane on Peyton Drive. Additional entrance details will be included on a map attached to your confirmed reservation. Sign up for your time slot at www.chinohills.org/RecOnline. The number of passengers must not exceed the number of safety belts/seats in your vehicle. Tickets should be printed and posted on the vehicle's driver side dashboard at time of entry.

Precautions will be in place due to COVID-19. Participants must be from the same household, remain in vehicle at all times, and wear face coverings. Candy will only be distributed through one window of the vehicle and into one candy bag/container, passengers will need to divide their candy up away from the event to ensure safety to all participants.
