

## Registration Procedures

The Community Services Department encourages advance registration for all programs since the majority of classes require pre-registration. Registration will not be accepted at class sites. Except for Tiny Tots, mail-in registration will be processed on a first-come, first-served basis and must be received by the Community Services Department no later than one working day prior to the class start date. If a class specifies "material fee due to instructor," please do not include that fee with your payment. Pay that fee to the instructor on the first day of class.

**Program times and dates are subject to change.**

## Please Enroll Early!

Nothing hurts a class more than participants who wait until the last minute to enroll. There is a point when classes must be cancelled due to insufficient registration. To ensure a successful class, please enroll early.

## Administration Fee

To help supplement the increased costs associated with the Community Services Department and to serve the patrons more effectively, the Community Services

Department adds a \$4.00 administration fee to all classes. We thank you for your continued support of the City of Chino Hills and our Recreation programs.

## Non-Resident Fee

A \$5 per contract class fee will apply to all non-residents. A \$10 non-resident fee will apply to Adult Soccer, Aquatics and Day Camp as reflected in the class fee. A non-resident fee may apply to special events.

## Special Needs Accommodations

The Community Services Department offers a wide variety of programs, classes, and activities that are described within this City News & Recreation Brochure. If you or a family member has special needs, and an interest in any of the classes or programs that are offered, please call Recreation at (909) 364-2700. Staff is happy to discuss accommodations that can be made to help you, or your family member, feel comfortable participating. Persons with mobility, sensory, cognitive limitations, or other concerns should not hesitate to contact our staff.

## Refund Policy

Refunds must be requested in person and submit a Cancellation/Transfer Form. All refund requests are subject to administrative approval by the Community Services Department. Please allow up to 6 weeks for refunds to be processed. Payments made via credit card will be refunded back to the credit card. Payments made via cash or check will be refunded by check.

**A \$4.00 per class, per participant, processing fee will be deducted from all cancellation requests, even if the refund remains as a household credit. Refunds may be retained as household credits to be used towards registration in future Community Services programs.**

Credits of \$15 or less will need to be used within one year. Credits of \$16 - \$99 are valid for three years. Household credits will not be issued over \$100. The Community Services Department reserves the right to cancel any activity or program due to low enrollment. If the department cancels a program, all fees will be refunded. A \$25 fee will be charged for returned checks.

## Adult Soccer

Requests for refunds will ONLY be honored if they are made immediately after the third league played game.

## Aquatics

All refund requests MUST be submitted to the *Chino Hills Community Center* at least 10 business days prior to the week you are cancelling. Refunds, less the \$4.00 processing fee, will ONLY be granted if your spot can be filled with someone on the waitlist.

## Classes

For classes with one or two meetings, requests for refunds will ONLY be honored if they are made at least one (1) day prior to the start of classes. For classes that consist of three or more meetings, the request for refunds must be submitted before the second class meeting.

## Day Camp

All refund requests MUST be submitted to the City Hall Recreation Office at least 10 business days prior to the week you are cancelling. Refunds, less the \$4.00 processing fee, will ONLY be granted if your spot can be filled with someone on the waitlist.

## Trips & Tours (City Sponsored)

Refunds must be requested by the printed deadline in the City of Chino Hills Recreation Guide & City News. If request is submitted by the deadline, then a refund, minus the non-refundable deposit, and the \$4.00 processing fee, will be issued. Otherwise, a refund request will only be honored if the City is able to fill your vacated spot(s).

Need a passport? Please be aware that City Hall will suspend its Passport Acceptance services between Monday, December 12th and Monday, January 2nd. At all other times, passport hours are from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday; 7:30 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday; and 7:30 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. on Friday. Visit the City Clerk's Office on the second floor at City Hall, 14000 City Center Drive, to apply for your passport. The City Clerk's Office takes passport photos, however they do not process passport renewals. ## Tree Recycling



Residents can recycle their holiday tree by chopping it up and placing it inside their “yard waste” container or by placing it on the ground next to their containers on the regular collection day. Tree recycling will be underway from Tuesday, December 27th to Saturday, January 7th. All decorations, tinsel, and the tree stand must be removed. Holiday trees larger than six-feet tall must be cut in half in order to be eligible for pickup. Flocked trees cannot be recycled and must be chopped up and placed inside the trash container or contact Republic Services at (866) 238-2444 for a bulky item pickup.

## Holiday Trash Schedules

If your regular trash day falls on, or after Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day (observed December 26th), and New Year’s Day (observed January 2nd), your trash pickup will be delayed by one day. Republic Services will be working hard to get caught up and back on the regular schedule.

## Order an Extra Trash Container for the Holidays

Chino Hills residents may order an additional trash container to handle the extra trash generated by gift-wrapping, holiday parties, and family gatherings during the holiday season. To order an additional trash container, please call Republic Services toll free at (866) 238-2444. In most cases, an extra container can be delivered within 10 days. The cost for one additional trash container is \$6.55 per month. Republic Services requires customers to keep the extra container for a minimum of six months or pay a service charge.

## Street Sweeping Parking Enforcement Takes a Holiday

The City has declared a citation-free period for street sweeping day parking violations in order to accommodate the extra visitors expected in Chino Hills’ neighborhoods during the holiday season. The City will not issue street sweeping parking tickets during the Thanksgiving holiday beginning Wednesday, November 23rd through Friday, November 25th. Enforcement will resume Monday, November 28th.

This enforcement will also be suspended for the Christmas holiday beginning Monday, December 19th through Monday, January 2nd. Sweeping enforcement will then resume again on Wednesday, January 3rd. Other types of parking tickets may be issued during this time period as this applies only to street sweeping parking tickets. # 2016 Chino Hills Community Heroes Honored

## Linda Briney-Fernandez – Community Hero

Linda Briney-Fernandez was honored as the 2016 Chino Hills Community Hero. She has been a resident of the Sleepy Hollow area in Carbon Canyon since 1967. She proudly continues her parents' legacy of community involvement and volunteering. Her mother, the late Sue Briney, was a leader in the incorporation of Chino Hills. Her father, Don Briney, was a long-time volunteer with the Citizens on Patrol. In 1984, Linda started the Carbon Canyon Women's Club with seven neighborhood women. She served as President, Vice President, and Secretary of the club. Linda organized events in the community including the Halloween Ride of the Headless Horseman, holiday programs, and more. Linda was quick to step up as team mom for sports teams and room mom at school. She served as Den Leader and Lifeguard for the Boy Scouts of America. Linda has been a member of the Chino Hills Historical Society since it was formed in 1994 and currently serves as Secretary. She was very active as a band booster at Canyon Hills Junior High School and at Ayala High School.

When the Chino Hills Community Foundation formed the Chino Hills Arts Committee (chARTS), she quickly became a volunteer. She is a tile maker, ceramicist, and professional photographer. Her work has been displayed at the Chino Hills Community Center. ### First City Council Meeting

The first City Council Meeting was held on Sunday, December 1, 1991 (Thanksgiving weekend) at Gerald F. Litel Elementary School. The newly-elected City Council was sworn in. Gwenn Norton-Perry received the highest number of votes and was selected as the first Mayor. James S. Thalman had the second highest number of votes and was selected as the Mayor Pro Tem. Michael G. Wickman, Gary G. Larson, and Ed Graham were the remaining members of the first City Council.

Those priorities included:

1. Providing an Increase in Law Enforcement Services
2. Establishing a Library
3. Creating an Economic Development Plan
4. Attracting a Regional Mall
5. Maintaining the Rural Atmosphere

7. Creating Citizen Commissions

# Stage II Moderate Water Conservation Alert

## One Day Added to Outdoor Watering Schedule!

In July, the City declared a Stage II Moderate Water Conservation Alert which allowed the community to add another day of outdoor watering for a total of three times per week. The City's water staff completed an analysis and determined that if the drought conditions persist over the next three years, the City of Chino Hills' water supply would slightly exceed demand by one percent. The City is in compliance with the Governor's Executive Order and the State Water Resources Control Board's extended emergency regulations (May 2016).



## Outdoor Watering is Limited to Three Days Per Week

Residents and businesses are limited to three outdoor watering days per week and shall not exceed 15 minutes (use multiple start times) per watering station (total). An exception for drip or micro-spray irrigation systems will be permitted but shall not exceed 30 minutes (use multiple start times) per station (total). Outdoor watering between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. is prohibited. These regulations do not apply to properties using recycled water.

## Even and Odd Addresses

- Residential addresses ending in an even number may use water on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Saturdays.
- Residential addresses ending in an odd number may use water on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Sundays.
- Non-residential addresses may use water on Tuesdays and Fridays.

## Learn More

Education is an important part of the City's efforts and we encourage our residents to help share this information with friends and neighbors. Nearly 23,000 flyers were mailed with the water bills to provide water customers with the updated regulations.

# Review of Water Rates Underway

The City is conducting a review of water rates. The rates have not been reviewed since 2011. The water utility is an “enterprise fund” which has a separate accounting and financial reporting for all revenues generated and all costs incurred related to providing water service to residents and businesses. The water utility is also not allowed to make a profit, but is expected to charge rates that reflect actual costs for providing the service.



## What is Included in the Rate?



Water rates must include the cost of water and everything that is necessary to deliver water. The cost to operate a water system includes the fixed costs for items that must be in place whether water use is up or down. Fixed costs include items such as pipes in the ground, repairs and replacement, personnel costs, energy costs related to the need to pump water to higher elevations, water storage reservoirs, and water treatment to ensure that the water is of high quality and meets State and Federal standards.

## Water Rate Trends

Trends in the water industry regarding the structure of water rates take into consideration recent legal actions that challenged tier-based rate structures that were not supported by actual costs, the ongoing drought conditions in California, and new technology that can provide water utilities with information about the water requirements of individual properties.

## Next Steps

In August, the Public Works Commission reviewed various water rate setting principles and methodology, and provided direction to staff and to the City’s consultant. Several rate principles, which the Public Works Commission supported, were that rates should: encourage conservation, be equitable to reflect different user profiles, maintain revenue stability, and be sufficient to cover fixed costs and commodity (water) costs. Staff is incorporating the Commission’s comments as they apply the principles to the water rate review. The item is tentatively scheduled to return to the Public Works Commission on November 2, 2016 for additional review prior to submission of the study’s results to the City Council. ## City Hall Blood Drive – December 13th



The City of Chino Hills has scheduled a Blood Drive on Tuesday, December 13th from 1:00 to 6:00 p.m. at the Government Center parking lot located at 14077 Peyton Drive. Donors must be at least 17 years of age, in good health, and weigh at least 110 pounds. Blood donors should drink plenty of

decaffeinated liquids prior to donating blood and must present a valid photo identification. Medical personnel will check your temperature, blood pressure, pulse, and iron level. If you meet eligibility requirements, about one pint of blood will be collected. Please consider donating blood! Call (800) 879-4484 to reserve a time. Walk-ins are welcome.

# New Ordinance Restricts Short Term Stays Defines Boarding Houses

The Internet has changed the way people plan overnight stays. With the introduction of VRBO, Airbnb, and other sites that provide a way for homeowners to attract short term overnight renters, some Chino Hills residents have noticed activity of this nature in their neighborhoods. They expressed concerns to the City Council about a constant rotation of people in and out of specific homes, noting that the transient nature of the visitors had a negative impact on their neighborhoods. They felt that permanent residents had an interest in being a good neighbor whereas short term visitors did not have that interest.



Residents have also expressed concerns about homes being rented to individuals on a room-by-room basis. To address both concerns, the City Council adopted an ordinance to maintain the integrity of neighborhoods and regulate temporary lodging in residential zones to address both short term rentals/leases of residential units. The new ordinance also regulates numerous tenants living in one residential unit.

As of July 14, 2016 commercial temporary lodging uses of less than 30 consecutive days is prohibited in all residential districts. In addition, “Boarding House” is defined as a dwelling rented to three or more individuals under concurrent, separate rental agreements or leases. Boarding houses require a conditional use permit and may only be located in commercial zoning districts. The various Chino Hills Municipal Code Sections that relate to these regulations include: Section 16.02.140, Section 16.12.020, CHMC Section 16.10.020 (E). City staff is checking VRBO, Craig’s List, and other sites that list homes in Chino Hills and notifying property owners of the new regulations. The Chino Valley Fire District offers Heartsaver® CPR & Automated External Defibrillator (AED) (Part I) online. The cost is \$35. In addition, Heartsaver® First Aid with CPR & AED (Part I) is also offered online for \$50. All course work is completed online. In order to complete the course, you must attend a skill session to demonstrate your knowledge at 6:00 p.m. on the third Thursday of the month, January through October. ## City Takes the Lead in Reducing Water Use



Over the past year, the City reduced its monthly water consumption by approximately 26% (2015/16 vs. 2013). Approximately 500,000 s.f. (11.5 acres) of turf have been removed and replaced with drought tolerant landscaping and drip irrigation. The City covered most of the costs with rebates from the Metropolitan Water District and the Inland Empire Utilities Agency.

Staff continues efforts to locate areas where turf is not used as a play area, but might be replaced with a more appealing landscape. On Galloping Hills Drive a small pocket park with a picnic table was selected for a turf replacement project. The turf had gone brown due to the need to conserve water. Public Works / Parks & Landscape staff planned

and designed a makeover for this area. The remodel took place over a three-week period. The turf was replaced, a decomposed granite path was created, drought tolerant plants were added, and a drip system using recycled water was installed. Parks & Landscape staff selected plants that would attract bees, butterflies, and birds. What was once an eyesore, due to the drought, is now an inviting place to enjoy. Residents are encouraged to visit locations throughout the City to get ideas for their own makeovers!

# Save Your Trees During This Historic Drought



The drought is having a major impact on trees! Trees in irrigated landscapes become dependent on regular watering. When watering is reduced, or stopped completely, trees will die. Tree loss is a very costly problem, not only in expensive tree removal, but also in the loss of all the benefits that trees provide.

To save water AND your lawn trees, slowly and deeply water mature trees one to two times per month with a simple soaker hose or drip system toward the edge of the tree canopy. Young trees need five gallons of water two to three times per week. You can also catch water in a bucket while you wait for your shower to warm up and use that water for your trees as long as it is free of soaps or

shampoos. Do not over prune your trees during the drought – it can stress out your trees.


Trees take a long time to grow! Let's all do our part to help our trees through the drought. The drought weakens our trees and makes them more susceptible to disease. If we lose our mature trees, it will take 10, 20, or even 50 or more years to grow new trees. That is a long time to wait for shade, oxygen, and beauty!

First Day Hikes are part of a nationwide initiative led by America's State Parks to encourage people to get outdoors. Healthy Hills is joining forces with Chino Hills State Park to have a First Day Hike on New Year's Day 2017! Hundreds of free, guided hikes are organized in all 50 states! Kids and adults of various fitness levels will be able to explore Chino Hills State Park with knowledgeable State Park staff and volunteers. It will be a fun experience for the whole family.

Chino Hills State Park is a gem right in our own backyard. There is no other State Park, in an urban area, where people can drive a short distance and be swept away with scenic vistas as they hike, bike, or ride a horse on over 90 miles of trails. ## Completion Near for TRTP



Southern California Edison's (SCE) project to underground the Tehachapi Renewable Transmission Project (TRTP) has been underway since September of 2013. Multiple contractors have been constructing the project in order to reduce the impact on Chino Hills residents. Cable installation is complete throughout the utility right-of-way. Barring any unforeseen circumstances, the TRTP line will be energized during the fourth quarter of 2016. The right-of-way is being restored with drought tolerant plants in areas that previously had vegetation. Other areas will be hydro-seeded or covered with mulch. This project is the first of its kind in the United States. SCE and the City of Chino Hills want to thank Chino Hills residents for their patience as the final milestone of the project is reached.

## Sandbags Available

The City has delivered sand and sandbags to Fire Station No. 4, on Carbon Canyon Road at Canon Lane; and to Fire Station No. 2, located on Butterfield Ranch Road at Sagebrush Street in Chino Hills. Citizens with proof of residency will be issued 25 sandbags per household. Bring your own shovel to fill the sandbags. If your property requires significant sandbagging, visit a local hardware store to purchase necessary supplies. Some hardware stores provide free sandbags.



## What Happens to the Cans and Bottles at City Parks?



Even though there are no recycle containers at City parks, the materials are recycled! All of the trash collected at City parks is taken to the Materials Recovery Facility (MRF) that Republic Services operates in Anaheim. The trash is dumped on conveyor belts and workers sort the recyclable materials. The same process recovers recyclable materials from apartments, condominiums, and most commercial properties in Chino Hills. This method of recycling has proven to be more effective than providing separate containers for recyclables at these types of locations.
