STREET CUT MORATORIUM POLICY

The City of Chino Hills places a street cut moratorium on any street that has been reconstructed or resurfaced. Any reconstructed street surface shall not be cut or opened for a period of five (5) years after completion. Any resurfaced street shall not be cut or opened for a period of two (2) years.

The City of Chino Hills Municipal Code Chapter 12.16.010, Paragraph 6 states:

"Any applicant who proposes to make an excavation, trench, street cut, or otherwise construct on, over, in, under, or through a highway which has been slurry sealed within the previous two years or resurfaced within the previous five years shall make additional repairs to the highway as directed by the City Engineer. Typically, these repairs shall consist of a minimum of slurry sealing the affected pavement from gutter line to gutter line along the entire length of the pavement disturbance. The City Engineer, to insure the integrity of the pavement and protect the public interest, may specify more stringent repairs."

The street moratorium was established in an effort to protect ride quality and the appearance of new street surfaces from utility cuts. The Engineering Division established pavement restoration guidelines to protect the integrity of the pavement surface from any work that requires a cut into moratorium streets. An exception may apply with the approval of the City of Chino Hills' Public Works Director. Refer to the map prior to submitting the encroachment permit application.
