The City purchases water from all of these agencies and will be passing through the actual costs based upon the fees and charges imposed by these agencies. All rates are rounded up to the nearest penny. The City will also adjust the above estimated charges to reflect changes, increases or decreases in electricity costs based upon charges and fees imposed by Southern California Edison. The City purchases electricity from Southern California Edison for purposes of transporting water from the various sources to each of the City's customers.

The Rates and increases set forth above are estimates based upon projected cost and charge increases but will be subject to adjustment from time to time to reflect changes, increases or decreases, in costs and charges imposed by the Metropolitan Water District, the Inland Empire Utility Agency (IEUA), the Monte Vista Water District (MVWD), the Water Facilities Authority (WFA), the Chino Basin Watermaster, and the Chino Basin Desalter Authority (CDA). The City purchases water from all of these agencies and will be passing through the actual costs based upon the fees and charges imposed by these agencies. All rates are rounded up to the nearest penny. The City will also adjust the above estimated charges to reflect changes, increases or decreases in electricity costs based upon charges and fees imposed by Southern California Edison. Wastewater (Sewer) Rates and Charges

The City's sewer (also known as "wastewater") rates are based upon (i) pass-through treatment cost agreements that are set by the Inland Empire Utilities Agency ("IEUA") which is the agency that operates the wastewater treatment plants that treat the wastewater generated by the residents, businesses and governmental agencies located in the City and, (ii) expenses incurred by the City to operate and maintain the wastewater transmission system that transports the wastewater from the customers properties to the IEUA treatment facilities.

Commercial sewer treatment rates are based on water consumption using IEUA's engineering factors for conversion into equivalent dwelling units (EDU(s)). Below are EDUs for the various types of commercial land use types.
