Have a Plan – "Ready, Set, Go"

- Make Sure the Entire Household Knows the Plan
 - You may need to collaborate with neighbors when away from home
- Identify Special Needs Moving Elderly or Incapacitated
- Plan for Large Animal Transportation and/or Boarding
- Gather Necessary Items:
 - Eye Glasses
 - Medications
 - Cell Phones/Chargers
 - Valuable Documents
 - Basic Clothing
 - Credit Cards or Cash on Hand

Have a Plan – "Ready, Set, Go"

- Have a Predesignated Location For Family to Reconvene at that is Away from the Emergency
- Please Leave when the Evacuation Order is Given
 - Allows Emergency personnel will be able to give their full attention to the emergency
 - Lost items can be replaced

During the Incident

- Try to Be Patient
- Sign Up for Emergency Notifications Before an Emergency Happens
- Do Not Return to Impacted Area until Authorities
 Advise that it is Safe to do so

Incident Stabilized – New Hazards May Exist

- Be Mindful that Emergency Responders May Still be in the Area Working to Return to Pre-incident Conditions
- Maintain a Heightened Level of Awareness While Driving Through Impacted Areas
- Exercise Caution if Damage to your Property has Occurred
 - Downed electrical Wires, burned vegetation
 - Realize additional challenges may come from flooding and mudslides, if inclement weather is forecasted
- Report Any Issues to the Proper Authorities Immediately
